Anne-Françoise Spinoit is full pediatric and reconstructive urologist in the department of Urology at the Ghent University Hospital, Ghent, Belgium and Professor at the Ghent University. She became in 2018 the first female Professor in Urology in Belgium.

She received her initial medical training at the Facultés Universitaires Notre-Dame de la Paix in Namur, Belgium, and in the Université Catholique de Louvain, Brussels, Belgium.

She had her training in Urology initially in France and subsequently in the Ghent University Hospital.

Dr Spinoit's fields of interest are robotics, congenital penile malformations and urogenital reconstruction in children, adolescents and adults. She has successfully defended a PhD thesis about it. She is a member of three multi-disciplinary teams — paediatric urology and nephrology; disorders of sex development and prenatal urology at Ghent University Hospital, and is involved in urogenital reconstruction.

She is President of the Société belge d'Urologie, and is a board member of the Belgische Vereninging urologie (Scientific Secretary), the European robotics Society, the Société Française d'Uologie Pédiatrique et de l'Adolescent (Scientific Secretary), but also member of various professional associations including the European Association of Urology, the American Society of Urology and the International Hypospadias Society. Dr Spinoit is Section Editor for the Journal of Pediatric Urology (Innovation and Technology) a reviewer for many urology journals. She has presented many papers at national and international meetings and has authored and co-authored more than 30 publications in peer-reviewed journals. She is also involved in teaching pediatric urology as member of the ESPU's educational committee.
